WHY I LOVE COA



I returned to school after being away for several weeks. There was a large stack of homemade children's cards on my desk, with such child-like simplicity, but sincere words and wishes: in English, Russian, Ukrainian. There are a few days before the opening of the new school building. The principal of the school, pushing aside her papers, and together with everyone: parents and employees, helps to paint the walls in the classrooms. A fifth-grade teacher was hospitalized. She returned defeated, after a "hopeless" diagnosis. When she was unable to care for herself at home, another teacher took her to her home and cared for her until her last days. A mother brings her daughter to school and asks me, "Do you remember when I was in the sixth grade and the teacher sent us to your office?" I have been working at COA for

more than 20 years. School is not easy. Being a student is not easy. And being a teacher, in so many ways, is not easy. But when the hard times come, we remember the good times and moments. And every morning, with joy, I want to return to these special children and adults at COA again and again.

Беспокоилась о ней до последнего. Мама привела в школу свою дочь. Вспоминает: "А помните, как я

училась в шестом классе и учитель прислал нас к вам в офис?" Я работаю в школе COA уже больше 20 лет. Школа – это непростое. Быть студентом – непростое. И быть педагогом в разных категориях этого понятия непростое. Но когда в твоей памяти всплывают вот такие моменты, то каждое утро снова и снова хочется возвращаться к этим, удивительно особенным, малышам и взрослым. В школу COA.

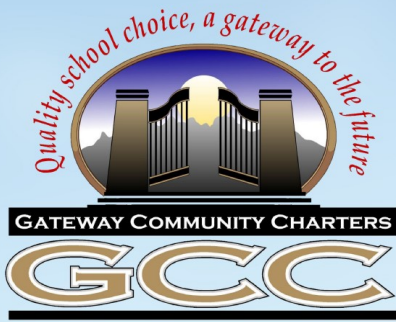

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) provides funds to assist low-income households with water and wastewater bills. LIHWAP is a federally-funded state-administered program that can provide a payment or credit towards a water or wastewater (sewer) bill. We can credit a water/sewer account between \$200 and \$371 and can pay overdue bills up to \$15,000. This is a one-time program that CRP delivers to Sacramento, Yuba, and Sutter counties.
